Kevin Case, along with his wife Linda and daughters, Emma and Sarah, both Lewis Mills graduates, have lived in Harwinton since 2006.

Kevin is in his 14th year working with the Land Trust Alliance, a national organization focused on the role of land conservation in building healthy and vibrant communities.

Prior to joining the Alliance, Kevin worked for the National Park Service. He oversaw a federal Wild and Scenic River Study on the Eightmile River and a National Scenic Trail Study for what is now the New England National Scenic Trail.

Previously, he was Executive Director of the Farmington River Watershed Association in Simsbury and currently sits on the board of the Connecticut Land Conservation Council.

As a candidate for Zoning Commission Alternate, Kevin is excited for an opportunity to have a role in making Harwinton the best community it can be

Darren Frechette is a business owner and PhD Economist who moved to Harwinton 13 years ago because of its rural character and great schools. He is 50 years old and has 3 children and 4 step-children, ages 11 to 18.

Darren's main community activity has been coaching youth soccer, which he has done almost every spring and fall (and sometimes winter) for the last 20 years. He loves bright fall days and fresh fruits and vegetables from local farms and orchards.

His metal fabrication business in Bristol employs 15 people and was started by his grandfather in 1937. Before taking over the business from his father, Darren was a professor at Penn State University where he taught economics and management to students in the College of Agricultural Science and published scholarly research on commodity markets.

Darren sees serving on the Board of Assessment Appeals as an essentially nonpartisan position where his financial background will help ensure fairness for Harwinton resident concerned.



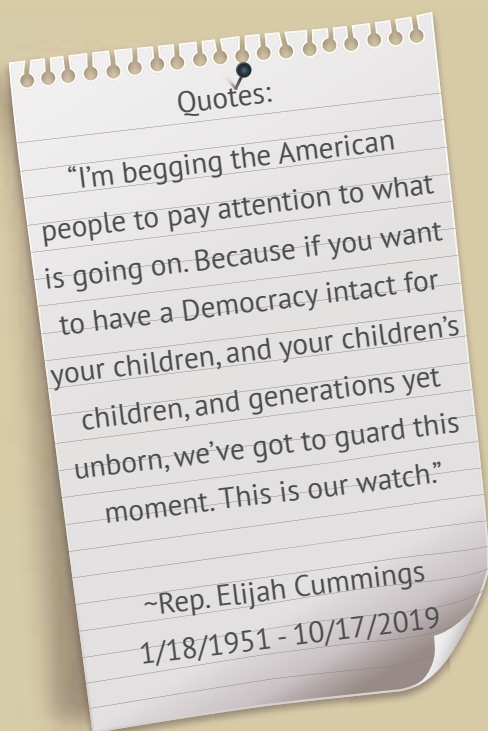

Canvassing is Going Well by Paul Honig

While I'm running unopposed, I think it's important to try to speak with as many residents as possible, Democrat, Republican or otherwise. My goal is to knock on every door in town, all 2000 of them. It looks like I'll be able to accomplish this by Election Day. Since the beginning of September with the aid of my mountain bike, I've been to about 1250 doors, attempted to contact 2450 voters and made over 525 contacts. My main takeaways are that people:

- like that property taxes have remained stable
- are concerned about speeding cars
- are very interested in investigating bringing fiber-optic internet to Harwinton

It's been a fun ride so far. I've met a lot of nice and interesting people, seen some really cool properties and got a lot of exercise going up and down our big Harwinton hills.
